The children will be learning about: -

Week commencing:

28 th February	Making Pancakes with different toppings - (Pancake Day – 1 st March) Listening to stories - (World Book Day – 3 rd March)
7 th March	“Jack and the Beanstalk” Story
14 th March	Growing our own beans Red Nose Day (18 th March)
21 st March	Mother’s Day Card (Mother’s Day – 27 th March)
28 th March	Garden Centre – Role Play
4 th April	Easter Celebrations – Easter Bonnet Parade/Sing-along/Raffle/Cake stall

Things we would like the children to bring, practice or read about, if possible:

w/c 28 th February	Donate pancake ingredients Flour/eggs/different toppings – oranges/syrup etc. Dressing up as favourite book character Encourage your child to look at their favourite book and retell the story.
w/c 7 th March	Donations of broad beans or other seeds, soil, plastic pots/cups etc. Watering cans and any other bedding plants would be lovely too.
w/c 14 th March	Donations of small scraps of material and other sparkly items. Dressing up in something “red”
w/c 21 st March	Items for our garden centre e.g. artificial flowers, boxes, coloured tissue, ribbon, packets of seeds etc.
w/c 28 th March	Parents to help their child make an Easter bonnet for our parade.
w/c 4 th April	Donations for our cake stall and support us by buying a raffle ticket.

Pasta, rice, corn flour, shaving foam, bottle tops, buttons, paper, pebbles, shells, envelopes, and other materials are things the children use on a daily basis so they will be much appreciated.

As part of our long-term planning, we will be including and encouraging parents/carers to complete the “50 things to do before you’re five” throughout the year, so please download the app: www.50thingstodo.org if you have not already done so.
